
Did you know there are over 70 retail shops in Uptown Waterloo? Take a stroll through the core to find great gift ideas or treat yourself to something new!

Waterloo Region also organized a Glow Ride to celebrate the Uptown Waterloo Bike Lane Launch which occurred on the same evening, encouraging cyclists to explore Uptown by bike while dressed thematically with glowing attire. The successful event showcased and engaged artists, while actively encouraging community members to experience Uptown in a new light – complete with new and unique LED lighting structures. 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
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

early every one of Waterloo's quintessential heritage buildings is serving a different purpose now than when it was originally built but it's these changes in identity that illustrate the history of Uptown. Take for example 14 Erb Street West. After housing an insurance company, a bank, and a police station, it is now home to technology companies working in one of the most sought after commodities - data. The Communitech Data Hub occupies the building now.

Looking down the street to Erb and Caroline, we find one of Canada's most architecturally (Governor General's Medal in Architecture) renowned corners. Once called the Distillery District, it is centred around the Seagram Barrel Warehouse and is easily one of Waterloo's best known and photographed areas. Currently host to Shopify, one of Canada's most exciting tech firms, the district combines work and play with the Seagram Lofts just metres away on Caroline Street.

Mixing work and living spaces in the core of Uptown creates a vibrant, diverse and successful community. Even a century ago, families like the Koeller's mixed work and play at 44-48 King Street South (now



office further down King Street has survived. The building will soon receive new life as it becomes a bustling office space over the next couple of years.

King Street has so many classic buildings to celebrate, including the storied Huether Hotel, that the tales in just this one corner would make a fantastic book.

One block over to Regina Street, we find Paul Puncher, which was famously built by The Grand Trunk Railway. When active, the station would see up to nine trains a day. It's a special place where hundreds of soldiers left for the World Wars, making it a location to preserve forever in our memories.

Respecting, renovating and reusing our historic buildings keeps our Uptown core thriving. Each building has a story and I encourage you to learn more about your favourite building. Whether you are walking, cycling or driving, take the time to admire the old and well-maintained facades. As we protect and appreciate these historical buildings, we are recognizing a new balance between old and new.




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
