GREETINGS FROM THE MAYOR OF WATERLOO	<ul> <li>Congratulated Dana Shortt for winning Business of the Year and also RideCO and S&amp;V Uptown for their awards at the Chamber's Business Excellence Awards (held night before) – noted that this speaks to the vibrancy and work done by the BIA to attract great businesses</li> <li>Mentioned the regular walkabouts with Tracy to meet Uptown businesses – met 60 so far</li> <li>Shared quote from Scott Higgin's book "It's not enough to just live in a community – you have to enjoy it"</li> <li>Draft of City Strategic Plan coming in May, asked Tracy to circulate with Board members, once received</li> <li>Provided an overview of her motivations to run for office and previous experience – e.g. climate change was an important factor</li> <li>Mentioned that garbage bins near transit stops have been reinstated as part of the new regional Waste Management budget</li> </ul>	Dorothy McCabe

	<ul> <li>Civic Common: longer-term vision including water station public space, Heritage Green etc.</li> <li>Public Square: water feature, permanent shade structures and movable shade elements.         <ul> <li>Construction starting this month</li> <li>Hoping to finish work before May 24 weekend</li> <li>Signage to be installed with pictures and QR code for people to find out more</li> <li>Heritage Green: on track top be open to the public by end of June: including public washroom, seating, gardens and Uptown heart bench.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Alnoor mentioned idea of potential iconic Waterloo sign</li> <li>Scott mentioned example of Barrie sign that was funded by privately-raised capital and asked how external partners could help with funding</li> </ul>

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE	<ul> <li>Noted upcoming lane and road closures for patios and activations</li> <li>Shared about the recent hiring of part time Program Coordinator, Kaitlyn Lackenbauer-Cox and high school co-op student, Special Project Assistant – Blair</li> <li>New businesses: Midnight Snack, Pilot Coffee Roasters, Poppy's Bagels, Grillies</li> <li>Closures: Oasis Joe Barbershop</li> <li>Mentioned that some new businesses choose Waterloo because their realtors suggest it, great place to pilot and open a business.</li> <li>Vlad mentioned that Miller Thomson would be moving in to the old KPMG space in a few weeks with more than 80 lawyers and Dollarama (8000 sq. ft.) opening on Willis Way</li> <li>Melissa suggested promoting more testimonials from new businesses for the "Why Waterloo?" website page</li> <li>Main Street program (Laura Munz) has wrapped up.</li> <li>City has put out survey regarding adding accessibility projects to the CIP         <ul> <li>Melissa mentioned this could be a great news story</li> <li>Melissa mentioned importance of winter patios and activations</li> <li>Mandy suggested advocating to the Region to increase patio sizes and other improvements and encourage easing of regulations along Regional sections of King Street</li> <li>Melissa asked if there was data proving that there have not been any issues related to ION in Uptown e.g. umbrellas blowing onto tracks etc.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Scott mentioned that the new Strata development will be made up of almost 70% two-bedroom units and that they have been having some issues related to hydro</li> <li>Melissa asked for a list of all current development applications in Uptown – Tracy to follow up with Kristin</li> <li>Scott mentioned the potential of a Waterloo high-line project</li> <li>Discussion held around the sale of the consolidated Mr. Sub and Ethels block</li> </ul>	Tracy Van Kalsbeek (Kristin sent regrets)
